Professor of Systematic Theology, Waterloo Lutheran Seminary, 1963-1975. Professor, Department of Religion and Culture, Wilfrid Laurier University, 1975-1985.

Born 8 July 1919 in Finland, Dr. Siirala studied at the Universities of Helsinki and Lund. He served as parish pastor and director of youth work (1943–46), then taught and later became the principal at the Adult Educational College and the Evangelical Academy of the Church of Finland (1946–1960). He studied in New York 1960–63. From 1963–1975 as professor of systematic theology at Waterloo Lutheran Seminary, and from 1975–1985 as professor in the Department of Religion and Culture, Wilfrid Laurier University, he taught courses in both schools until his retirement in 1985.

Both as a Luther scholar and as an internationally recognized authority in the relationship of theology and therapy, he was a major influence in reforming the doing of theology and theological education. His books include Gottes Gebot bei Martin Luther, The Wholeness of Life, The Voice of Illness, and Divine Humanness.
